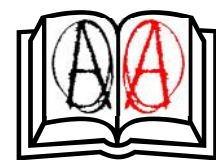

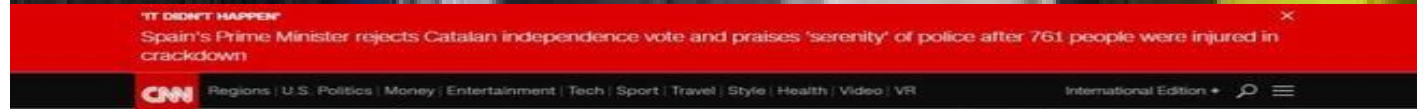

Hundreds hurt as Catalonia poll descends into violence

The Spanish government last night sought to defend its response to the Catalan independence referendum after more than 100 people were hurt when Spanish riot police stormed polling stations and seized ballot papers in a last-minute effort to stop the vote.

Although many Catalans managed to cast their ballots in the poll, which the Spanish authorities have declared illegal, others were forcibly stopped from voting as schools housing ballot boxes were raided by police acting on the orders of the Catalan high court.

The Ramon Llull school in central Barcelona was the scene of a sustained operation, with witnesses describing police using gas to smash the doors, charging through and firing rubber bullets.

Speaking last night, the Spanish prime minister, Mariano Rajoy, said the government had done what it had to, and thanked the police for acting with "bravery and serenity".

"We are the government of Spain and I

The country's largest supplier of supermarket chicken has suspended production at one of its main processing plants after undercover filming revealed poor hygiene standards and food safety records being altered.

The plant, owned by 2 Sisters Food Group, will be closed temporarily and workers at the site will be put through a retraining programme. The decision to halt production came as Tesco, Britain's largest supermarket chain, joined the boycott of the poultry group's West Midlands plant following a joint undercover investigation by the Guardian and ITV News.

A spokesman for the company, which supplies a third of all poultry products eaten in Britain, said: "We are shocked and distressed by the allegations and the footage which we saw for the first time on Thursday 28 September. Since the allegations were put to us by the Guardian and ITV, we have been working around the clock to get to the truth of the matter."

"The Food Standards Agency has been in daily attendance since the allegations were raised and confirmed that it has not identified any breaches. However, our internal investigation has shown some isolated instances of non-compliance with our own quality management systems."

"We have therefore decided to temporarily suspend operations at the site to allow us the time to review all colleagues, including management, in all food safety and quality management systems."

A Tesco spokesman said: "Following last week's allegations of poor practices at 2 Sisters we conducted additional quality assurance visits. We found no evidence of non-compliance and our investigation supported the Food Standards Agency's findings that there was no current evidence of food safety breaches."

"However, there have been isolated incidents where food quality procedures have not been followed and therefore, in

Ministers tell May to sack disloyal Johnson

Theresa May was coming under mounting pressure last night to dismiss Boris Johnson after he put her credibility on the line with his latest public demands on Brexit.

The foreign secretary's announcement of his "red lines" for any deal that Britain strikes with the EU forced the prime minister on to the back foot as the Conservative Party conference got under way.

She had wanted to use the gathering to start a political fightback with a freeze on university tuition fees and the expansion of subsidies for first-time homebuyers in a package that will cost at least £11 billion.

Instead, questions over her leadership dominated the opening day, prompting ministers and backbenchers to demand that she regain control of her cabinet by dismissing Mr Johnson. He stood accused of allowing his personal ambitions to drown out the Tories' attempts to counteract Labour's electoral momentum.

"She needs to sack Boris or stand down," a minister said. "His every utterance is calculated to damage her. It cannot go on." Another minister said that Mr Johnson was a "constant international humiliation", adding that the foreign secretary had "zero parliamentary support."

Asked if Mrs May would survive if she dismissed him, the source said: "There would be an initial explosion."

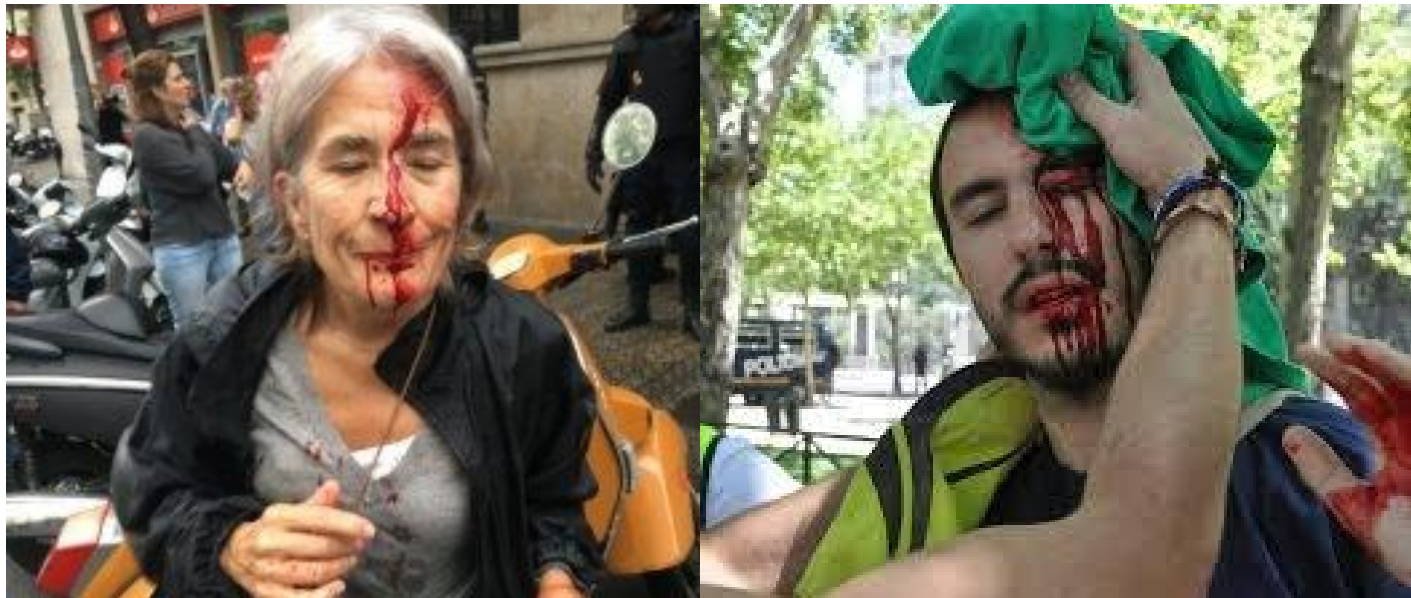
